- **\$50.00 nonrefundable application fee** (drawn on a U.S. bank in U.S. funds, payable by check or money order to Purdue University) if you have never attended a Purdue campus;

- If you are admitted to Purdue University, you will be required to complete a NOTICE OF INTENT (NOI) form, which will be mailed with your letter of admission. You must return the NOI with:
 - official financial support documents from your sponsor's bank
 - a copy of your passport
 - a completed "Transfer Form" and copy of your current I-20 if you are currently attending a U.S. school
 - a fee deposit
