### Who should complete this application?

- Applicants who want to participate in the joint Ivy Tech Lafayette/Purdue West Lafayette Pathway to Purdue Program in the Purdue College of Agriculture.
- Applicants who have been deemed "program ready" by Ivy Tech Lafayette.
- Applicants who have already completed an application for admission to Ivy Tech Lafayette.
- Applicants who have submitted their most recent high school transcript to Ivy Tech Lafayette. If the applicant received a high school general equivalency certificate, both a final high school transcript and GED scores must have been submitted to Ivy Tech Lafayette.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- A nonrefundable \$50 application processing fee is required for Pathway applicants who have not already applied to Purdue West Lafayette as degree-seeking students.
- A \$200 late registration fee will be assessed to anyone who schedules for the fall or spring semesters on or after the second Monday of classes; for all summer modules, this fee will be assessed on the second day of classes.
- Pathway Nondegree students are not eligible for financial aid at Purdue. Students may be eligible for financial aid through Ivy Tech.
- Pathway Nondegree students must complete and meet all of the required program criteria in order to be admitted as degree-seeking transfer students to Purdue's College of Agriculture.
- Be aware that there are deadlines regarding when students can withdraw and/or modify their schedules and that refunds are based on when a student withdraws or drops a class.
- Falsified information provided on the application may result in denial of admission and/or termination of enrollment at Purdue University.

### POLICY STATEMENTS
