## 1 | STEWART CENTER

Home to the Office of Admissions and Boilermaker Station Welcome Center, Stewart Center houses many student services, an art gallery, a multi-story library and two auditoriums. Stop by the West Foyer Lobby to see *The Spirit of the Land Grant College*, a mural by Eugene Savage depicting Purdue's mission.

## 2 | MEMORIAL MALL

As the heart of our academic campus, Memorial Mall is always buzzing with activities and students making their way to classes. It's also home to the life-size bronze statue of John Purdue, the university's benefactor and namesake.

## 3 | UNIVERSITY HALL

University Hall is the last remaining building of Purdue's original six-building campus. Behind it, you'll find one of Purdue's many iconic fountains. In the warmer months, students run through the fountains as part of a fun campus tradition.

## 4 | CLASS OF 1950 LECTURE HALL

The Class of 1950 is one of our largest lecture halls. Visit the second floor to see a 700-pound bronze statue of two students from Purdue's Class of 1950. Out front stands our Diversity Tree — often painted with the letters of one of Purdue's multicultural sororities and fraternities or Divine Nine organizations, along with advertisements for upcoming events.

## 5 | WILMETH ACTIVE LEARNING CENTER

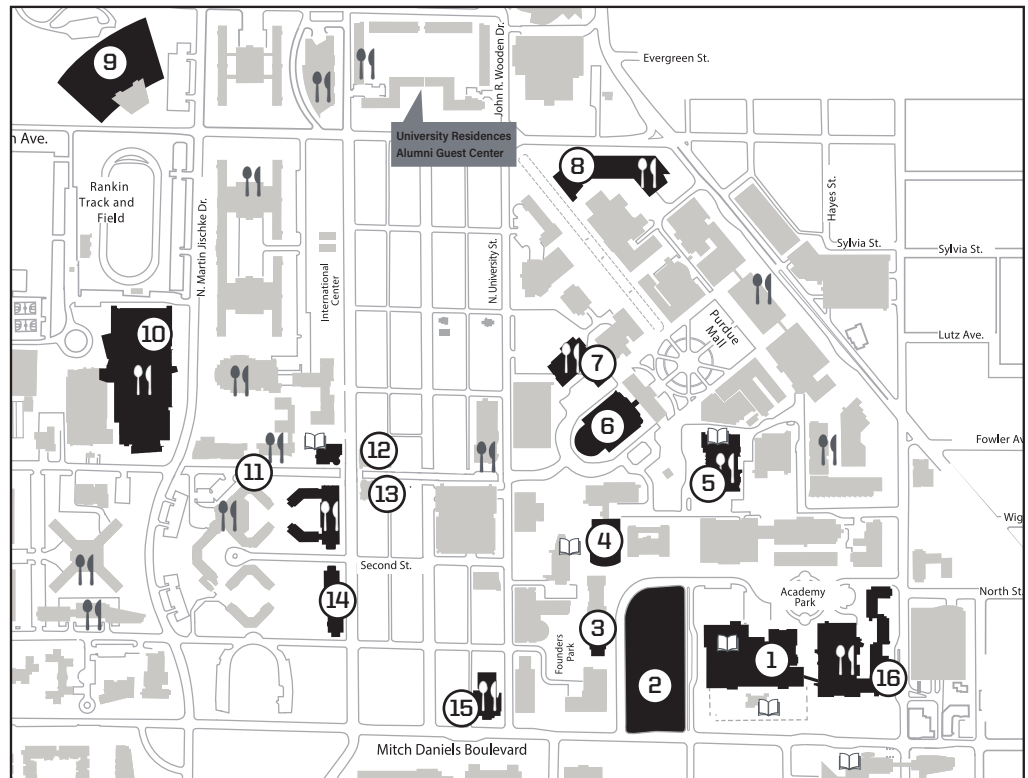
With its collaborative classrooms, study spaces, library and café, Wilmeth Active Learning Center is a central hub for students on campus.

## 6 | ELLIOTT HALL OF MUSIC

Home to hundreds of world-class performing arts events each year, as well as Purdue ceremonies and performances by Purdue Musical Organizations and Bands & Orchestras, Elliott seats 6,005 people — surpassing Radio City Music Hall in New York City!

## 7 | CHANEY-HALE HALL OF SCIENCE

With 33 state-of-the-art laboratories, this "lab of the future" is made up of flexible spaces that can easily be adapted to changes in teaching and learning that are yet to come.

## 8 | NEIL ARMSTRONG HALL OF ENGINEERING

Just outside Armstrong Hall sits a statue of Neil Armstrong, the first man on the moon and a beloved Purdue alumnus. Surrounding his statue is a replica of his steps across the lunar surface.

## 9 | SLAYTER HILL

Slayter Hill is the perfect place for a picnic or a game of disc golf while overlooking Purdue's gorgeous campus, and when there's snow on the ground, you're sure to see students sliding down the hill on everything except a sled!

## 10 | FRANCE A. CORDOVA RECREATIONAL SPORTS CENTER (COREC)

The CoRec has something for everyone, including several floors of fitness equipment, a 55-foot climbing wall, an Olympic-sized swimming pool and multiple tracks and gyms. Boilermakers can also take advantage of the CoRec's Wellness Suite, which offers nutrition and cooking classes, financial wellness resources, massage therapy and more.

## 11 | THIRD STREET

Third Street is Purdue's pedestrian-only walkway. Here, students can relax and study outside, play games or grab a bite to eat.

## 12 | BECHTEL INNOVATION DESIGN CENTER

Inspired by students looking for a space where they can come together to design, build and create solutions to real-world problems, Bechtel is an advanced prototyping mixed-use facility where all are welcome!

## 13 | MARC AND SHARON HAGLE HALL

As the home for Purdue Bands & Orchestras, Hagle Hall contains rehearsal and practice spaces, faculty studios and collaboration areas. When not in use by the Purdue "All-American" Marching Band, you'll also find the World's Largest Drum on display in the big picture window on the ground floor. Built in 1921, the drum is 10 feet tall and weighs 315 pounds.

## 14 | JOHN MARTINSON HONORS COLLEGE

Students in the Honors College at Purdue live and learn together, participating in interdisciplinary academic courses, undergraduate research, community and global experiences and leadership development.

## 15 | MARRIOTT HALL

Stop by Marriott Hall for a coffee or treat! Marriott is home to many incredible dining experiences led by students in the School of Hospitality and Tourism Management as part of their experiential curriculum.

## 16 | PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION

The Purdue Memorial Union is the center of daily life on campus. With several dining options, coffee shops, study spaces, a bowling alley, an art gallery and even a hotel and spa, the Purdue Memorial Union has it all!
